Introduction

In 2020, the Gosport and Fareham Multi Academy Trust proactively responded to the challenges presented by the COVID pandemic.

Well-being and the learning of our children and families was at the forefront of our action. Enabling and harnessing the skills and expertise across the Trust, we formed a GFM COVID Recovery Strategy.

The GFM approach to premium spend is learner centric and needs led, our use of additional schools funding associated with COVID Recovery Premiums, Pupil Premium and Service Premium is focused on this principle. We are committed to ensuring that we gain understanding of need by seeking evidence through robust assessment for all learners. Enabling us to identify and respond to those that require well-being, academic, social, emotional and mental health support.

Our planning, support and intervention strategy is centred upon removing barriers for our young people and enabling them to access learning, while closing knowledge and skill gaps, alongside accelerating their progress. We achieve this with a three tier approach to COVID recovery strategy and application - whole school development, targeted action and well-being support.

These are our objectives, achieved via our three Tiers;

- Remove 'barriers' to learning for all our pupils.
- Support pupil well-being.
- Ensure sustainable progress in Literacy and Oracy for all targeted pupils.

Of the £295,120 the GFM received from the government for the COVID Premium, nearly 100% of the funding was spent, providing focused activities in direct response to the challenges brought about by the COVID pandemic. Highlights included:

- Small group (max 4:1) and remote Tutoring across all our schools.
- Upskilling our workforce to respond to the challenge and pedagogy associated with remote learning.
- Literacy and Oracy interventions and assessment.
- New methods to track 'well-being' and impact.
- Access to specialist and therapeutic services for individuals, families, mental health support, crisis support and assessment of need.
- Character development.
- New digital resources, accessible anywhere.
- Holiday provisions and evening tutoring.
- Emotional Support and wellbeing sessions.
- Use of the National Tutoring Programme (NTP)

Impact and Outcomes

The GFM managed to provide summer access provision for a remarkable number of pupils during the summer of 2021.

Year 7 Pupils who accessed our target support summer plan resulted in improved progress and a reduction in reported anxiety levels. Over 300 plus pupils benefitted from bespoke interventions.

Summer brought the opportunity to facilitate joint endeavours, supporting community engagement, with the GFM opening our facilities and making them available for local organisations to provide local events and activities.

Further highlights throughout the past year include:

- 92% attendance to targeted intervention activities.
- Mentoring from Sixth Form students for over 180 pupils across the Trust.
- Brune Park School being ranked 6th in the Country for progress achieved on a DFE recognised recovery tracker.
- 78% of Primary pupils identified that small group work had encouraged them to confidently return to school following 'lock-down'.
- 64% of Primary pupils saw an increase in progress across Reading and Maths.

- Primary average attendance was 96%.
- Special school attendance for Year 7 above 94%.
- Graduate Tutors provided additional learning hours, with nearly 500 pupils benefiting.
- All day activities at Easter and Halfterm facilitated through third party organisations such as Premier Sports and Kings Camps.

Over a thousand pupils attended the summer provision from the GFM from 26th July until 27th August 2021.

ImpactEd has been used to track the outcomes of our strategies and interventions, this cloud based system ensures pupil voice and need is heard loud and responded to. This approach enables us to measure impact on progress and well-being in real-time.
